A white slave, though a willing one, is Mrs. Mary L. Henderson, late of Umatilla, more recently of Pendleton and now of Portland.

For nearly 18 long years Charles F. Henderson and his wife, lived happily as man and wife. Then one day Mary left their home in Umatilla to come to Pendleton and according to a suit for divorce filed yesterday by her husband, she straightway lost her heart to a gay Lothario, Henry J. G. Akimoto, by name, a subject of the mikado.

The suit alleges the woman committed adultery with this Japanese in the city of Pendleton during the month of March, of this year. From other sources it is learned that it was only last week that the woman who had lived with her white spouse for 18 years without discovering he was not her affinity, fled to Portland with Akimoto.

The Hendersons were married at Huton, W. Va., July 31, 1890, but have no children as the result of this union. Three years ago they came to Umatilla from Missouri and Mr. Henderson is now employed as a laborer in that town.

The wronged husband does not seem anxious to seek his erring wife, simply desiring to have severed the tie that binds.

Another "Not Loaded" Gun.
