FLORA BOY IN SAD ACCIDENT

The Flora Journal says:
A very sad accident occurred Tuesday, which makes the home of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Miller of Buford ridge, seem very desolate.

Mr. Miller and two sons were finishing putting in a crop on the Grande Ronde river, on what is known as the old Sturgil place. William, the younger of the boys, who was nine years old last September, was harrowing and handling a team at farm work for the first time, and was justly proud of his success. On unhitching for dinner, just before noon and being at the far end of the field, he climbed on one horse, which was old and gentle, and rode across to where he had left his pony. While beginning to dismount, the horse became frightened and the boy was thrown. A foot slipped through the cross check which had been snapped to a hame and almost formed a half hitch around the ankle. The horse ran, dragging the boy about 150 yards. The greatest injury was probably done while passing between two logs. One who was at the logs since, says that there was a knot on each one and that the head was evidently caught by these and then loosened by a sidewise jump of the horse. Flesh, hair and blood were left on the logs. The horse then jumped a wire fence and the shoe was jerked from the imprisoned foot, releasing the boy. The father and brother who witnessed the whole procedure, immediately had Dr. Gilmore summoned, but each side of the head was badly hurt and the brain crushed and no skill could save the young life. He passed away at 10 o'clock that evening.

The body of the deceased was carried up the hill Wednesday morning and interred in the Paradise cemetery yesterday at 2 o'clock p. m. Rev. Baltheder conducting the services.

William Miller leave a father, mother, one brother and seven sisters to mourn his untimely end. The relatives have the sympathy of our communities in their bereavement.

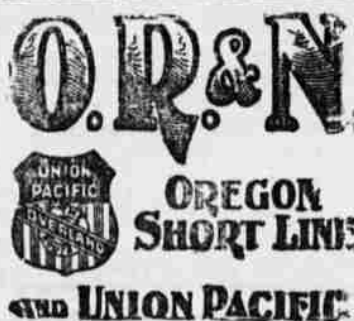
REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.
