FAIRBANKS ENDORSED

Indianapolis, Ind., April 1.—Four delegates at large, pledged to the support of Vice-President Fairbanks, and 15 national electors will be elected by the republican state convention, which assembled at 2 o'clock this afternoon. This will make the full quota of 39 delegates from Indiana, all of whom will vote for Fairbanks. The state convention is composed of 1467 delegates. It will reassemble at 9 o'clock tomorrow morning for the purpose of nominating candidates for governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, auditor, treasurer, attorney general and other state and judicial offices. It is understood that the Indiana delegation will vote solidly for Fairbanks in the national convention as long as there is any possibility of bringing about his nomination. In case of evident failure, it is more than likely that Indiana's entire strength will be thrown to Taft.

Almost beyond doubt every one of the 39 delegates will go to Chicago heartily loyal to Vice-President Fairbanks, and will work enthusiastically for his nomination for president. Mr. Fairbanks has the support of nearly every republican newspaper in Indiana and has been endorsed by the republican state central committee, the Republican Editorial association of Indiana and by every district committee in the state. The state committee has completed its organization for the campaign in Indiana, and the party organization has been completed in every district, county, township and ward.

The republican party in Indiana has no serious factional differences this year, the contests for places on the state ticket being spirited but friendly.

The Indiana delegates to the Chicago convention will be supported in their efforts to nominate Mr. Fairbanks by thousands of Indiana republicans, many of whom have reserved hotel accommodations for the occasion.

BIG LOG ROLLING.

Woodmen of the World Are Planning for a Grand Time.

The Woodmen of the World of Baker City are planning for one of the greatest events in their history when the head officers of the organization will be here from Denver on April 13, says the Herald. I. I. Boak, the head consul, and all of the other officers of the head camp will be here to personally confer degrees upon the applicants, which will number about 200. Delegations from La Grande, Union, Elgin and Sumpter will be present, and it is probable that special trains will be run for their benefit.

A committee has already been appointed by the local camp to interview the merchants and have them decorate their stores for the occasion. The coming of the head officers of the lodge is looked forward to with great interest and the local lodge intends to give them such a welcome that they will ever remember Baker City.

To Try Oil Promoters.

Topeka, Kan., April 1.—H. H. Tucker, Jr., promoter and founder of the Uncle Sam Oil company, will probably be placed on trial during this month's term of the United States district court. Tucker is alleged to have used the mails to defraud in the sale of the stocks of his concern. People all over the country were investors in Tucker's company, which was for a time glaringly advertised as the future rival of the Standard Oil company.

NEW RULING EFFECTIVE

Washington, April 1.—The famous order of the postoffice department, requiring that the second class or pound rate shall not apply to newspapers or periodicals mailed to subscribers who are in arrears, becomes effective today. The order was aimed at the cheap weekly and monthly mail order journals, but it has aroused a storm of protest in all sections of the country. Subscriptions to daily papers, under this rule, must be paid within three months, to monthlies, within four months, and to weeklies, within a year.
