WHITMAN MUSICAL CONTEST

Walla Walla, April 2.—(Special).—The entries for the musical contest to be held at Whitman college in about a month, close today. A large number of contestants is expected at the contest, which will be held in the Whitman Memorial chapel April 23 and 24.

This contest is believed to be the first of its kind ever held in the Northwest and is attracting the attention of music teachers and students all over this section. Each music teacher in three states is invited to send one representative for each of the departments of the contest, although many will be represented in only one department or two. Contests will be held in vocal, piano, organ and violin.

The prizes are four in number and aggregate \$1400. The winner in each department is awarded a scholarship which covers all the principal expenses of a year in the Conservatory of Music, including all tuition fees, and board and room in one of the college dormitories. Each of these scholarships is of a value of \$350.

The judges in the contests will be members of the faculty of the Conservatory of Music, and no one connected with the institution will be eligible to compete.

TRACK MEET A SUCCESS.

Assurance has been made by President Penrose of Whitman college, that the high school track meet to be held at Whitman college April 29 and May 1 will be one of the most successful ever pulled off here.
