"Doctor" Leroy Fuller was this torning admitted to ball in the sum f \$5000 by an order of Judge Smith nd upon the presentation of a satisactory bond was released from cus ody, says the Baker City Herald, Fulor has been an inmate in the county all since his conviction on the charge of manslaughter last July. At that ime his ball was fixed at \$10,000. which he was unable to give. Upon epresentations made by his attorney, . L. Rand, the bond was reduced and Villiam Saunders and G. B. Fuller, Dr. J. Myers of Union, and David Gover of Eagle valley, were arested in October, 1996, charged with he crime of manslaughter in causing he death of Abble Gover by performng a criminal operation. A separate rial was demanded, Fuller was tried t the June term of 1907, the jury isagreed and he was tried again in uly and convicted. On July 10 he reeived a sentence of 10 years in the tate penitentiary and a fine of \$2000. Ie appealed his case, which is noy ending in the supreme court.
