WALLA WALLA ELECTRIC LINE EXTENDS TO WALLOWA

Activity in the development of the electric lines in the Inland empire shows within a few years, the entire section of country from Spokane to Umatilla will be covered with a network of lines. The consolidation of the Walla Walla Traction and the Oregon & Washington lines at Walla Walla and the efforts to secure additional franchises and right of way for the new company in the direction of Pendleton is evidence that this city is the objective point of the company, says the Pendleton East Oregonian.

On next Monday evening the company will present a formal application to the city council of Weston for a franchise to use the streets of that town and work of securing right of way between Weston and Milton is being carried on constantly.

The Walla Walla Statesman of Monday says of the activity of the new company and of its plans for the development of this section of Oregon: Franchise was asked from the county commissioners this afternoon by the Washington-Oregon Traction company to run their line along the county road, leaving the city limits at the cemetery and thence along the east side of the cemetery for half a mile. Here the line enters the private property and consent of the county officials is not necessary. The franchise will probably be granted.

This is another step in the development of the electric road, the announcement of which was made some time ago. The backers of the proposition say that work will be begun as soon as possible and pushed to an early completion.

It is to run south to Athena, Weston, Wallowa, Pendleton and to Bingham Springs, rumor says, before it is completed. There is also another well-founded report which says that this road is to be merged with the Pomeroy-Astoria-Walla Walla road, which is in the preliminary stages of construction.

The consideration of this franchise was the only business of importance before the commissioners today.

There is not the least doubt about the intention of the Walla Walla Traction company to build to Pendleton, according to the statements of those who are in a position to know, and it is thought that as soon as the Weston franchise is secured that work will begin between Weston and Pendleton to secure right of way and franchises, if needed.

FULLER IS OUT.

Has Been Incarcerated in the County Jail for Nine Months.

"Doctor" Leroy Fuller was this morning admitted to bail in the sum of \$5000 by an order of Judge Smith and upon the presentation of a satisfactory bond was released from custody, says the Baker City Herald. Fuller has been an inmate in the county jail since his conviction on the charge of manslaughter last July. At that time his bail was fixed at \$10,000, which he was unable to give. Upon representations made by his attorney, I. L. Rand, the bond was reduced and William Saunders and G. B. Saunders, merchants of Richland, went on his bond.

Fuller, Dr. J. Myers of Union, and David Gover of Eagle valley, were arrested in October, 1906, charged with the crime of manslaughter in causing the death of Abbie Gover by performing a criminal operation. A separate trial was demanded, Fuller was tried at the June term of 1907, the jury disagreed and he was tried again in July and convicted. On July 19 he received a sentence of 10 years in the state penitentiary and a fine of \$2000. He appealed his case, which is now pending in the supreme court.

On September 12, 1907, the case against Dr. Myers was dismissed upon a motion of the prosecuting attorney. The case against Gover, upon whose life the operation was performed, still stands and he will be tried when Fuller's case has been decided.
