**EXCURSION
TO BAKER**

It appears that between 75 and 100
La Grande Catholics will visit Baker
City tomorrow to attend the dedica-
tion of the splendid new cathedral at
that place. There will be no special
train, but an extra coach will be at-
tached to No. 6 tomorrow morning,
and in it will ride all of the La
Grande delegation. The exercises
at Baker are drawing visitors from
three states, and Catholics of eastern
Oregon will be there in great num-
bers. The fare is one and a third, on
the certificate plan.

The services of dedication at St.
Francis cathedral will take place
Thursday morning. Rt. Rev. Bishop
C. J. O'Reilly will conduct the im-
pressive ceremonies of the dedication,
which will begin about 10 o'clock. At
these services, according to the ritual
of the Catholic church, the church
should be empty, until after it has
been set aside by solemn prayer, to
the worship of God.

The clergy will assemble and re-
cite certain prayers, from the psalms
of Holy Scripture, then pass around
the outside of the church, then enter
the church, saying the prescribed
prayers. After these services, the sig-
nal will be given, when the people
will enter the church, and the solemn
pontifical mass be sung about half
past ten. A cordial invitation to the
people in general to assist at the im-
posing ceremonies Thursday morning,
is extended.

During the mass, the Most Rev.
Archbishop Christie will deliver the
sermon. Rt. Rev. Bishop O'Dea of
Seattle, Rt. Rev. Bishop Glorieaux of
Idaho, and Rt. Rev. Bishop Carroll
of Montana will be in attendance, be-
sides a large number of prominent
priests of the adjacent states. Taken
altogether, it will be the most impor-
tant religious function that ever has
been witnessed in eastern Oregon.

In the evening at 7:30, there will
be devotions, followed by a sermon to
be delivered by Bishop Carroll of He-
lena, Mont., to which service also, a
cordial invitation is extended to all,
to hear this eloquent and scholarly
prelate, whose sermon will be most
interesting and instructive.

Members of the clergy will dine at
the Geisler Grand hotel on Thursday.
It is expected by the Rt. Rev. Bishop
O'Reilly that fully 40 of the most
prominent clergymen of the north-
west will be in attendance on Thurs-
day next.

A very elaborate and beautiful mus-
ical program has been prepared for
both services.
