Proceedings of the commissioners' court for the April term, 1908:

In the matter of the monthly allow-
ance of various indigent persons, the
following warrants were ordered

In the matter of the appointment
of a county fruit inspector, C. D.
Huffman was appointed.

In the matter of the petition of the
La Grande Investment company to
open up certain roads in Union coun-
ty, the same was continued for the
term.

In the matter of the appointment of
a supervisor for road district No. 14,
Ole Mathson was appointed.

In the matter of the proposed coun-
ty road petitioned for by W. R. Jasper,
et al, the report of the viewers
was approved and the road was or-
dered opened up and placed in repair
for travel.

In the matter of the petition of J.
H. Hubbard, et al, for an election to
be held in Union county, Oregon, on
the question of whether or not the
sale of intoxicating liquors shall be
prohibited in Union county, Oregon,
the petition was granted and an elec-
tion was ordered within Union county
as a whole to be had on the first day
of June, 1908, to determine whether
the sale of intoxicating liquors should
be prohibited in said county, and the
notice as provided by law.

In the matter of the petition of S.
L. Given for a refund of taxes paid
for the year 1907, the petition was
denied.

In the matter of the petition of G.
M. Jasper for a rebate of taxes paid
for the year 1907, the petition was
granted and the clerk was authorized
