DEDICATION AT BAKER

The Baker City Herald of Thursday says:

The dedication of the St. Francis de Sales cathedral took place this morning and the services were attended by hundreds of people, the large church being crowded to its seating capacity. A large delegation came up from La Grande and Pendleton and several others were in attendance from other parts of Oregon, Idaho and Washington.

At 10 o'clock the procession of prelates and clergy moved from the St. Francis academy, forming a most imposing sight. The ceremony of the dedication was performed by Rt. Rev. C. J. O'Reilly, D. D., who sprinkled holy water upon the sidewalk and steps, and blessed the exterior and interior walls, while the psalms and litany were chanted by the clergy.

After these services the church was opened and the clergy and people entered. The most solemn and beautiful pontifical high mass ever observed in this city was celebrated by Bishop O'Dea of Seattle. The sermon was a masterful discourse on the dignity of the apostolic and episcopal office and was delivered by Archbishop Christie of Portland. The services continued until 12 o'clock and the beauty and solemnity of the occasion held the large audience until the close of the service.

The musical program last evening was even more brilliant and interesting than it was at the morning service, for most of the singing was solo work, which was very fine.

The dedication of this cathedral, which is the finest in Oregon, and one of the most imposing in the northwest, is a notable event in the history of the Catholic church in the northwest, and was attended by a large number of prelates, clergy and laity. Lane, master of ceremonies; Rev. P. Placidus, O. S. B.; Rev. P. Dominic, O. S. B.; Father Lawler, O. P.; Rev. J. Gallagher, C. S. C., president Columbia university, from the Oregon City diocese; Rt. Rev. Father Vander Denck, Rev. Father Goodschalt, Father Varbregt, Rev. Father Reis, Rev. Father Kelly, of Idaho; Rev. A. Verwilghen, Rev. A. Verhagen, Rev. F. Van de Ven, Rev. Father Collier, S. J.; Rev. F. Rebban, S. J., of Washington; Very Rev. A. Bronquest, vicar general; Rev. Father O'Rourke, Rev. Father Cantwell, Rev. Father Noon, Rev. Father Kerr, Father Hynes, Father Neate, S. The beautiful cathedral stands as a monument to the untiring industry and zeal of Bishop O'Reilly, who took charge of the work four years ago, this coming fall, being the first incumbent of the See. He began the erection of the cathedral in 1905, laying the cornerstone in that year. The cost of the building will run upwards of \$50,000 and praise to Bishop O'Reilly, there is not a cent of indebtedness on it. The structure is built of native stone, is 140 feet long, 68 feet wide in the main and 50 feet in the nave. The height of the towers is 114 feet, and from the floor to the ceiling in the interior is 42 feet. The seats are made of oak, and the seating capacity is 550. The enrichments are of antique oak, while there is a large amount of decorations of white plastic work. The windows are of beautiful cathedral glass, giving a soft light and beautiful tint to the interior. The building is heated by steam and lighted by gas and electricity.
