More Pavement for Pendleton.

West Court street, from Main to Star, a distance of 10 blocks, is to be paved. Action to this effect was taken by the council last evening, when a petition was presented to that body, signed by more than half the property owners on that street. The pavement will be either asphalt or bitulithic with the preponderance of sentiment apparently in favor of bitulithic, as this kind of pavement is now in use on Main and Court streets, and is giving satisfaction. When the work is completed this one street will have 24 blocks of pavement.
