WILL REMAIN DRY.

Prominent Business Men of Wallowa County Express Their Opinions.

George S. Craig, the well known stockman and banker of Wallowa county, and B. B. Boyd, who for the past three years has been engaged in the real estate business at Enterprise, came out last evening.

These gentlemen were interviewed last evening by an Observer representative regarding the result of their two years' experience as a "dry" county, and as the question is again to be voted upon at the June election, what, in their opinion, the result would be.

Both gentlemen were emphatic in their expressions as to the belief that there was no question whatever as to the result, and the vote in favor of continuing dry would be greatly in excess of what it was two years ago. That two years ago both gentlemen recited the fact that the great majority of the business men were opposed to a dry county, they believed the wiping out of the saloons would be an injury to business.

Business in every way was greatly improved instead of being demoralized. We are now paying their debts, supporting and educating their families who did not do so when Wallowa county had saloons.
