RUSK HAS A CHAMPION.

Ivanhoe, Who Ought to Know, Stands By His Deputy.

Feeling that it would be only fair to the voters of Union county to know who the candidates are, and what they represent, who are now asking the nomination for joint representative for this and Wallowa county, we interviewed Colonel Ivanhoe, who has a personal acquaintance not only with the candidates, but with the local conditions at Joseph. In a talk with him he said, among other things:

"Yes, I have known Mr. Rusk for about six years, in fact, since he first came to Joseph. He has been associated with me ever since, and a more conservative, competent and honest man does not practice law in either county, taking into consideration the fact that he is yet a young man. He is also, without posing as either a reformer, or using his position as an instrument of persecution in the hands of any faction or class, absolutely fearless in the performance of his official duty. He has been my deputy in that county since my election to the office of district attorney and, under my written instructions, he has prosecuted any and all persons, where he had evidence sufficient to justify a verdict of guilty, and has and still does, under my directions, refuse to add a dollar to the expenses of his county, at the behest of any one, unless such evidence of guilty exists and can be had. And he does his duty fearlessly. Only a short time ago he was assaulted on the streets of Joseph, because he had offended some law-breakers, gamblers who undertook to chastise him for his presumption. The result of the encounter will be sufficient to teach those who are dissatisfied with the enforcement of the law, that it is a little dangerous to try to take it out of the hide of the deputy district attorney. It might not be out of place to say that Rusk will not get the vote of the law-breakers of the town of Joseph (his opponent will get them) but he will get the vote of the law-abiding element, simply because they have tried him, and know he will enforce the law if he has to scrap every criminal in the county. A better natured man does not live in the two counties, and he is representative also. He is a man of family, owns his own home, is a taxpayer, and knows the needs of the two counties. His opponent has no family, has been in the county about two years, and could not be regarded as having been here long enough to correctly represent and understand the legislative needs of the district. I notice the paper says he has an 'enviable record' as a law and order reformer. As I understand it, he was elected as a reformer, but failed to deliver the goods in other words, he imposed a small periodical fine upon gamblers and similar offenders, until the people complained to Mr. Rusk, who closed them out of business, and had to sustain his course by literally punching them into obedience. All this Rusk did without a hypocritical reform or pretensions. A vote at the primaries for Mr. Rusk is a vote for a taxpayer, an uncompromising republican, a capable, honest, faithful and fearless official. If the Joseph paper had been fair it would have said all this, as the contest is among friends, and whoever receives the nomination should be supported by all republicans. There is no merit in the statement that Mr. Eberhard was the first in the field. It is rather against, than for him. He was told by different persons that he had not been long enough in the district to entitle him to a place of such responsibility on the ticket. But he could not wait until his acquaintance would justify his ambitions, and announced himself.

"One thing more. When I appointed Mr. Rusk deputy, I authorized any one to report to me any instance in which he refused to prosecute any one for any crime, when the evidence was furnished, and if he so refused, I would appoint some one in his place. During the two years of his service, not one complaint has been filed with me. If he was not all I claim for him, he would not now be acting as my deputy. I present him on his record, and it will bear comparison with that of any one holding public position. Hoping all that has been said will aid in the selection of the best man, I am inclined to abide by the choice of the party at the polls. The candidate, after that date, is mine."

These who are not in possession of the facts, and know Colonel Ivanhoe can judge whether his estimate of the respective fitness of these candidates is well founded or not. He says a fair vote is a fair show for his friend.
