# RATES WILL END SOON

With about two weeks yet of colonist rates, there seems to be no hope for anything like flourishing business in the passenger department of the Harriman systems. For the month of March the total immigration business was extremely low, but even that will be higher than the present month, unless a sudden rush occurs at the eleventh hour. La Grande is one of the fortunate towns of Oregon, as it is one of the four cities on the O. R. & N. which have not been affected by the closed Portland gateway. Through the Huntington gateway, Huntington, Baker City, La Grande and Pendleton will not be benefited by the opening of the gateway to Portland on April 9. Even Portland itself does not anticipate any noticeable returns from the opening, as it came too late. In speaking of this incident, the Journal says:  
The Portland gateway has been open since April 9, but it is not believed the result will be to greatly increase the colonist movement. The fact is that there is a light movement of homeseeker travel this spring from the east, owing to the financial conditions that preceded the opening of sale dates, March 1.

**Take on Dismissed Men.**  
John M. Scott, assistant general passenger agent, who went to Puget sound and reduced the working forces in the passenger department there, and closed the Olympia office of the company, will go back over the ground immediately and restore to their former positions the men who are available. Four men will resume work in the Seattle office, three in the Tacoma office, and one in the Olympia office.

The principal reason assigned for the falling off of homeseeker travel over the transcontinental lines to the entire Pacific coast this spring is that eastern farmers and men of property who were last fall contemplating removal to the coast, found that they could not readily dispose of their property to advantage, and they are awaiting more favorable conditions of the money markets.

**Baker City Rink Burned.**  
Shortly before 2 o'clock this morning a fire alarm was turned in from Willovale and the firemen discovered that the Willovale skating rink was a mass of flames, says the Baker City Herald. The building was too far gone to be saved, so they devoted their attention and efforts to saving the structures nearby. The rink burned completely, only a few charred joists remaining to show that there had been a building there. The structure was a shell of wood and was so dry that it burned like tinder, taking the flames but a few minutes to lick it up. The building with its contents of skates and orchestrelle, was a complete loss. Bennet & Jessup, the owners, estimate their loss at \$7000, with no insurance.

The origin of the fire is a mystery, as it could be plainly seen that the flames broke out in the southeast part of the building, which is farthest from the office and the stoves. Some think that the fire was caused by defective electrical wiring, while others are of the opinion that it was of incendiary origin, as some people were heard to express their delight at the destruction of the rink, claiming that it was not a fit place for boys and girls to congregate.
