MAKE PAPER OF WHITE FIR

Forest Supervisor J. M. Schmitz of the Wenaha National Forest reserve, yesterday received a circular letter, together with a sample of white fir pulp, from the head office of the forestry department at Washington, D. C., outlining the possibilities of the paper industry in California and Oregon by the commercial use of white fir in making pulp. In view of the fact of the small commercial value of the white fir from a lumber standpoint, the department advocates its use in the manufacture of paper, as laboratory tests show that its value in this industry is much above that in the lumber trade.

There are in the forests of Oregon, California and Washington, large areas of white fir forests which have remained untouched by the lumbermen of the country because of their comparative small values with red fir and other timbers. As a consequence of this discrimination the valuable timber forests are fast disappearing, while the white fir areas are increasing proportionally. Some months ago the forestry department at Washington gathered samples of this wood and made chemical laboratory tests of its value for paper pulp purposes. The results of these indicate that the white fir is of great commercial value when used for pulp, as the waste is small and the grade of paper made from it is good.

Mr. Schmitz, in speaking of the probable commercial use of the white fir for pulp purposes, last night, said that he thought it was only a question of time until this wood will be generally used for the manufacture of paper pulp and its value increased accordingly.

In the Blue mountains, east and south of Walla Walla, are large quantities of this timber, and in the event that the movement advocated by the forestry department gains favor among the paper manufacturers of the country, it is merely a question of a few years until Walla Walla and the surrounding country will be supplied with home manufactured paper for all purposes. Such an enterprise would not only add many thousands of dollars annually to the country's income, but would materially cheapen the commodity in the local markets.

KILLED FIFTEEN BEAR.

Record Break for Bear Hunters in Wallowa County.

Harry Carpy of Wallowa county, is in La Grande today and has a beautiful specimen of a bearskin which he excluded from a sale of 10 furs at Elgin yesterday. Mr. Carpy has the distinction of having killed more bears in Wallowa county in one month than any other man. In a month's time he has killed 15 bear, 10 full-grown and five cubs. He knows where to look for them and knows how to get them. The animals are about to come out in feed, and consequently the fur is of the very best.

Royal Arcanum Convention.

Springfield, Ill., April 15.—Members of the Royal Arcanum from all over the state were in attendance when the annual convention of the order was opened in the State House today. The session will be continued tomorrow and several important matters will be considered. A movement has been set on foot to make this city the permanent convention headquarters of the order.

Michigan Democrats Meet.

Lansing, Mich., April 15.—Members of the democratic committee of Michigan met today to fix the time and place for the state convention. It is likely that the committee will indorse the candidacy of Bryan. Most of the committeemen apparently favor holding the convention late in May.
