HAVE NEW RATES SOON

La Grande shippers are awaiting anxiously for the effectiveness of the new distributive freight rates from Portland to points east of The Dalles. According to indications, it will not be long, however, as the Baker City complaint is about adjudicated and following such a consummation will be set the date when the new rates are effective. A Portland paper refers to the matter thus:

Up to the present time, though the decision was handed down a couple of weeks ago, the railroad company has had no intimation as to when the order will be signed, sealed and delivered. Judge Cotton, general counsel for the railroad corporation, admitted this morning that he had received a copy of the commission's decision identical with the copy published some time ago in the local press, but that places no obligation upon the O. R. & N. It did not come in the form of a mandate directing the company to revise and reissue tariff schedules to conform to the ruling, it being simply a notice that the railroad commission had announced its findings.

Since the handing down of the ruling, there have been a number of preliminary matters to attend to, which, it is understood, must be disposed of before the matter is in proper form for the issuance of the formal order. One of these matters is the complaint of the Baker City Commercial organizations which are asking for an equalizing rate out of Baker City.

A number of conferences in relation to the decision in this case have been held between Attorney J. N. Teal, counsel for the transportation committee of the Chamber of Commerce, the plaintiff in the case, and Judge Cotton for the O. R. & N. It is understood that each side has made a number of recommendations that are to be embodied in the official order, and in these recommendations a blank space is left for the filling in of the date after which the new rates shall apply.

Inasmuch as the new rates will lay off about one-sixth of the gross earnings of the O. R. & N. on all business originating in Portland consigned east of The Dalles, it is a safe bet that the O. R. & N. isn't going to sit up night-urgling the railroad commission to put the order into effect.

While definite information is not at hand, it is almost certain that as soon as the Baker City complaint has been adjudicated, which will be some time this week, the commissioners will prepare the order and fix upon the initial date for its operation.

Echo Alfalfa Meal Factory.

An alfalfa meal factory is to be started at Echo and it promises to furnish an important addition to the enterprises of the west end of the county. The factory is to be started by J. E. Murphy & Co., now conducting a similar plant in Portland and the plant will be established close to the Henrietta flour mill at Echo. The power of the flour mill will be used to operate the new factory.

It is understood that the new plant will be installed this summer so as to be in operation by fall. A plant valued at between \$25,000 and \$50,000 will be established and a force of eight or 10 men will be used in operating the same.

Alfalfa meal is used as a stock food and has become very popular as such during the past few years. Murphy & Co. have been operating a plant in Portland for two years and are said to have made money in the business. Alfalfa meal sells in the market for \$20 per ton and it is used largely in dairy sections in place of bran and shorts.
