An estimate by the British Board of Trade of the sugar production of the world for 1906 makes a total of 14,312,716 long tons, of which 7,217,-472 tons were cane and 6,995,244 tons beet, the production of both kinds advancing practically at the same rate since 1393. In the production of cane sugar, British India had the largest cerput of 2,223,400 tons, and in bect sugar Germany ranked first, with an output of 2.363,187 tons. In consumption of sugar per head Australia stands first at 129 pounds, the United States coming next with 89 pounds, and the United Kingdom following at \$1
