### To Educate "Poor Whites."

Memphis, Tenn., April 22.—Distinguished educators, university presidents, state superintendents, state men, editors, bishops, clergymen and club women, the leading intellectual lights of the New South, together with a considerable sprinkling of famous visitors from other sections of the country are guests of Memphis today and will attend the seventh meeting of the Conference for Education in the South. The opening session this evening will be addressed by Governor M. R. Patterson, who will welcome the visitors to Tennessee. The object of the conference is to educate and uplift the "poor whites" of the south and in this effort it has already been highly successful.

### Bryan in Bay State.

Boston, April 22.—Although there are contests in only six of the 25 Boston wards at the democratic caucuses today, it is evident from the indications that George Fred Williams and his wing of the democracy will make a determined attempt to capture the democratic state convention and send a pledged delegation to Denver for Bryan. In a large majority of the wards the candidates for delegates to the state convention and to the 14 congress district conventions are pledged to anyone, but it is generally understood that they will be for Bryan. Ward 16 is the only one in the city that is even favorable to the nomination of Governor Johnson of Minnesota.

Similar conditions are reported from other sections of the state, and it is likely that the Nebraska will secure a large majority of the delegates from Massachusetts. The state convention will be held in Boston on May 7.
