Arguments about the "plans of the father," and states rights will be worked over time when that body comien to take the mearure from the fudiciary committee intending to restrict the traffic of intoxicating Hquors between "wet" and "dry" states. <br> When the various bills on thls subfect were being conaldered by the committee there were almost as many different vlews expressed as there were members. The bill that finally got out of committee was a compromise. Instead of giving a "dry" state the right to hold up shipments of Hiquor at the state border, as desired by the prohibition forces, it merely prevents a rallroad from acting as agent for the conslgnor, and requifes the full name and addrens of both consignor and consignee to be inscribed on the package. <br> Some irritation is likely to be manifested when the debate comes on.
