EDITOR ON LONG TOUR

George H. Currey, lay delegate, to the general conference of the Methodist Episcopal church, accompanied by Mrs. Currey and Mrs. G. C. Osburn, leave Saturday morning for Baltimore, where the conference convenes on May 6.

This is one of the largest ecclesiastical gatherings in America. At this session there will be no less than 800 delegates, composed equally of ministers and laymen of equal authority. The last general session was held four years ago at Los Angeles. Baltimore has thus been honored six times previously, first in 1796, then in 1811, 1820, 1824, 1840 and 1876. The session is expected to continue 30 days. The party will stop on their way at Salt Lake, Ogden, Colorado Springs, Denver, Kansas City and St. Louis. From the latter point they will visit Memphis and possibly Atlanta, Ga., returning via Chicago over the Great Northern or Canadian Pacific. This will undoubtedly be a most interesting trip to all three, as they are all native born Oregonians, and this will be their first trip east of the Rockies. They expect to be absent about six weeks.

Slight Wreck Near Pendleton.

While the southbound Northern Pacific branch line train was a short distance this side of Fulton this afternoon, the tender trucks left the track and the train is now stalled there while waiting for a wrecking train. A portion of the passengers were brought to this city on a hand car arriving about 2:20.

After leaving the track the tender trucks bumped along the track for a hundred feet or more and demolished the track. It is said new ties will have to be placed for the entire distance.

When the trucks left the track the engine was reversed and the train brought to a standstill without harm and no one was injured by the wreck. Conductor Bertholet walked to neighboring farm house and phoned the news to Agent Walter Adams.—Pendleton E. O.

RAILROAD PROSPECTS GOOD.

Sub-Contractor Thinks New Road Will Soon Be Advanced.

While they would give out nothing definite in regard to the work on the road, they promised him that the old contractors on the road should have the work as soon as the work will be resumed this summer.—Wallowa Sun.
