NEW BOARD IS ELECTED

The New Board.

Thus reads the board of managers which will for the next year, have full charge of the reorganized Commercial club, which grew out of the old body and which, by all indications, will be a stronger, livelier and more energetic organization. This will be true because there will be more funds to work with.

About 75 business men attended the mass meeting at the Presbyterian church last evening when the by-laws committee was to report. The by-laws were adopted in the main as announced in The Observer last evening. One feature of the reorganization which was not mentioned last evening was the fact that the board of managers are empowered to secure the services of a competent manager who will, with the board of managers, have full use of the boost fund. As the by-laws specify that the president, a treasurer and secretary shall be selected from among the board of managers, it will be seen that these officers are still to be selected. This will be done early next week.

Bright prospects face La Grande commercially. With funds that will amount to \$6000 in a few days, the board can hire a competent manager who will devote his entire time to bringing payrolls and more home-seekers to La Grande. To do this, however, they must spend \$2000 or more of their fund for a manager's salary. The best is none too good. This action will no doubt be taken as soon as the board is organized.

The meeting last evening was enthusiastic, and the election of the board progressed with unity and smoothness. The results of the balloting is stated above.

Monroe is Candidate.

A good attendance answered the call of Fire Chief Joe Jones, of the fire department, last evening, and nominations for candidates to that office were received. Because Chief Jones retired in favor of W. M. Monroe, who was the other nominee, the latter is now the candidate and will be elected at a meeting of the department next week.

VERSATILITY OF THE LINOTYPE.

With Aid of This Machine Observer Turns Out German Job Work.

Readers of The Observer are familiar with the Esperanto appearing in these columns from time to time, but it remained for Fleck Superintendent Sebbelov, of the Amalgamated Sugar company to show his loyalty to La Grande institutions by having his printing done at home—and thereby hangs a tale. The Observer was approached with the work of printing a contract, to be used by the newly arrived Germans. With not a single German character in the office, and the German language as foreign to the printer as the lingo of the Chinese, the linotype was resorted to with the result that the work was completed to the entire satisfaction of Mr. Sebbelov. The entire job was set with English characters, and can be read as plainly as though the German alphabet was used. As far as known this is the first German work turned out of an exclusively English office, in the state of Oregon.
