A topic which needs especial atten tion in Union county and which should be acted upon by the school boards, is the subject of music in the schools. The La Grande schools especially, need this addition to the curriculum. That important topic was ably handled by Mrs. Nellie G. Nelli of this city. She presented truths worthy of attention and adoption.

"Natural Georgraphy" was a subject discussed at some length by E. M. Snider. Fifth Crade Reading" came in for some highly instructive plans by Miss Ruth Bush of this city. "The Teacher's Aid in the Pupil's Preparation" was likely full of helpful suggestions. E. W. Allen handled this subject. With the last-named paper, the meeting adjourned until after lunch. Promptly at 1 o'clock the work was taken up again by a very interesting discourse, "Our Educational Inheritance," by Principal Omen Bishop of Union.
