THE BOOST HONOR ROLL

WILL RAISE SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS BEFORE CEASING.

Few Dollars From Five Thousand is the Record Now—Will Seek Non-Resident Aid to Swell the Booster Fund—Present Committee in Office Until This Evening—Success Follows Movements of the Soliciting Committee Throughout.

Remarkable success has run parallel with the path taken by the special soliciting committee to raise booster funds. At the mass meeting last evening the committee reported money coming in rapidly and still more to hear from. With \$4948 on their list, as shown by the subscription published below, the committee preferred to retire in favor of one appointed by the new board of managers, which was selected last evening. But this was not thought advisable, however, and the terms of office for these men was continued until this evening. Today, the committee is making arrangements for appealing to non-resident land holders, and wealthy ranchers who live near La Grande. There is every indication of reaching the goal set—\$6000. With but little more than \$1000 to make up the deficit, there appears no logical reason why that amount should not be subscribed.
