> > The Fruit Industry.

"About a year ago there were 25,-000 acres of apples and pears in Jack son county alone," said Commissioner Carson. "This year 9000 more acres have been planted in apples and pears. About 65 per cent of the new acreage is in pears mostly of the Comice and Bartlett varieties. Dougias county is planting about 1003 acres of pears and apples this year, Prunes cover 2000 additional acres in that county. This makes, perhaps. 15,000 acres now set in prunes. In Josephine 500 acres of apples and 600 acres of Concord grapes. Jackson county has had about 150 acres of new grape planting. The land is b. ing cleared rapidly and next year there will be about 5000 acres of grapes, mostly Concords, planted in Josephine county alone,"-Valley Record.
