So far as we are able to learn there is no authentic record of an older hen to be found anywhere. She is the property of Mrs. Charles Knapp, who raised her and who knows beyond any doubt exactly how old she is. Each year, besides contributing her rightful share of eggs, she has hatched and cared for two broods of chicks. This year she shows no evidence of being ready to retire from business, and all indications point to the usual crop of egg and chicks for the year 1908. Mrs. Knapp does not know to what particular breed she belongs. The hen is almost pure white, having only a few black spots on her neck. Seventeen years in active service should be sufficient grounds for placing even a hen on the pension list.
