ANTI-RUM
SPEECH FINE

The skating rink was comfortably filled last evening with men and women who came to hear the address of F. E. Zimmerman, the state lecturer of the Oregon Anti-Saloon league. Mr. Zimmerman presented many strong arguments in favor of the suppression of the saloons. He enlarged upon the fact that aside from any moral feature or question as to the right or wrong of the liquor business, it was simply a business proposition, and that good business methods did not require the presence of the saloons. His lecture was illustrated with lantern pictures, which told the story equally as graphically as did his word paintings. Mr. Zimmerman will address other meetings in various parts of the county during the coming week.
