

THE GENERAL CHARACTERISTICS OF THIS FIELD SHOW IT TO BE OF THE NATURE OF A DRY. BARREN PLAIN OR BASIN, THE SUB-DIVISIONS REFERRED TO CONSISTING OF SILICIFIED AND CLAY SHALES, SANDSTONE, CLOSE AND COARSE GRAINED.

THE UNDERLYING FORMATIONS ARE CLAY, SANDSTONE AND CALCAREOUS CONCRETIONS, WHITE CALCAREOUS SHELLS, FOSSIL-IFEROUS CONCRETIONS, CARBONIFEROUS LIME AND LIME SHALE. THE FORMATION GENERALLY IS SUCH AS TO GIVE THE LANDS IN QUESTION A HIGH CHARACTER AS LANDS PECULIAR TO OIL FOR-MATIONS ON THE PACIFIC COAST.

THE SANDSTONE STRATA IS IMPREGNATED AND STAINED WITH DEPOSITS WHICH WOULD RESULT FROM SUCH SOURCE.



# SUPERINTENDENT BEARDSLEY'S RE PORT

Pendleton, Ore., April 28.—With over 800 signatures thereto, a petition asking that the people of Umatilla county vote upon the question of prohibition at the June election, will be filed with the county clerk this aftermoon.

For weeks past the petition has been circulated to some extent about the county and at present it is in the hands of Fred Taylor, who says that it is now ready for filing. The petition contains the names of nearly 306 voters, but owing to the fact that some of them were found to have failed to register they were cut out, thereby reducing the number to 802. As a result of the petition now

ready for filing the people of the county will become dry until voted otherwise by the people. Should the county as a whole not

go dry the status of the individual products will depend upon the voting in the same. A precinct casting a majority of votes for prohibition becomes dry, while a precinct showing a majority sentiment against prohibition becomes wet. When the county votes upon the proposition as a whole, there is no necessity for precinct petitions being filed.

At the clerk's office this morning a petition was received from Ukiah, but owing to the fact that the precinct boundaries were not properly described it has been sent back by Clerk Saling. But as the Ukiah people will have a chance to vote upon the proposition anyway, it will not matter if their petition is not returned before the first.

May 1, or 30 days before the election, is the limit for the filing of local option petitions.
