May term of the Oregon supreme court which sits at Pendleton twice each year, convenes next Monday morning. In all there are 14 cases on the docket, from Baker, Malheur, Union, Umatilla, Grant and Wallowa counties. From Union county there are two cases as follows:

Eliza Carroll, administratrix, appellant, Lomax & Anderson, attorneys, vs. the Grande Ronde Electric company, respondents, C. H. Crawford, W. M. Pierce, F. S. Ivanhoe, attorneys. Suit to recover damages for fatal injury caused by broken electric wire.

Eigin Forwarding company, respondents, C. H. Finn, attorney, vs. F. Cummings, appellant, J. W. Knowles, and R. H. Lloyd, attorneys. Suit to recover on open account, plaintiff, allowed \$297.06 and costs. Defendant appeals.

The more important of these two cases is, of course, the Carroll case, which has occupied the attention of the district and supreme courts for several terms.
