HEAVY TRAVEL EXPECTED. Low Rates Will Draw Many to Northwest This Year.

"This year will witness an unprecedented tourist travel to the northwest," said John M. Scott, assistant general passenger agent of the O. R. & N. and Southern Pacific, who was in Spokane yesterday from Portland, says the Spokane Review.

"The low rate westbound tourist rates will go into effect June 1 and from that time through the summer the tourist travel to Washington will be heavy, according to reports of inquiries made at eastern agencies. The northwest is the only part of the country that is not suffering from the effects of the recent financial and commercial depression and the people throughout the country at large have been generally informed of that fact through the press. Not only is the northwest the best advertised section of the country, but no other part of the United States is in a position to present such inducements to tourists, homeseekers and investors as is that which includes Washington, Oregon, and Idaho.

"From the character of the inquiries received, it is apparent that many people in the east are considering taking advantage of the westbound tourist rates to investigate the country with a view of making it their permanent residence. The travel to the northwest this year will be increased in volume by the fact that, compared with the conditions in the northwest, the commercial and industrial situation in the east is anything but good. "Naturally, we may expect quiet business throughout the country during the presidential year, but I think that the northwestern states will be affected less on this account than any locality."
