## EULOGY TO LATE JUDGE

The court house was well filled last night with a representative gathering of Pendleton men and women to do honor to the memory of the late Judge Thomas G. Halley, says the Pendleton Tribune. The members of the supreme bench, which is now in session in this city, occupied their accustomed places, Chief Justice R. S. Bean presiding. A series of resolutions eulogistic of Judge Halley's characteristics as a man, a citizen, a lawyer, neighbor and friend were presented by Robert J. Slater who, after delivering a short address, moved their adoption and they were unanimously accepted.

Judge Lowell made the principal address of the evening, and, having for a number of years been his partner in the practice of his profession he was regarded as being more familiar with Judge Halley's attributes as a lawyer, judge and citizen. Judge Lowell paid a splendid tribute to his memory and characterized him as one whose every aim in life was to be just to his fellows, true to his family and to fully discharge his obligations as a citizen of a state which he loved without hesitation or equivocation.

**La Grande Men Speak.**  
Similar Eulogies were pronounced by District Attorney F. S. Ivanhoe, J. D. Slater of La Grande, and W. M. Peterson of Pendleton. Judge Eakin, of the supreme court, also expressed his appreciation of Judge Halley's many excellent qualities of manhood, as he knew him through an acquaintance of 12 years, and Chief Justice Bean paid a splendid tribute to his affability when on the supreme bench during that trying experience of consultation when the merits of a case are being tried without the restraint of the customary formalities. At such times he was uniformly charitable toward the opinions of his colleagues, always disposed to contend for his own opinions, but at any time ready to recede if shown that he was in error.

The general tenor of the speeches was one of the highest appreciation of Judge Halley's attributes as known to the people of Pendleton, where his life was an open book and those present willingly accepted the eulogies of his associates in the law as not overdrawn, but merited by the splendid career of their departed townsman.

### RIPARIA LINE SOON READY.

Train Service on Snake River Branch This Month.

A Lewiston, Idaho, dispatch says: Within the next two or three weeks it is expected that the Riparia branch will be in a condition to permit the establishment of train service by the O. R. & N. company and it is quite probable that the construction department will inaugurate service similar to that now in operation on the Lewiston-Vollmer line of the Northern Pacific.

General Superintendent Buckley stated that he was anxious to have some kind of service inaugurated, but that the matter was in the hands of the construction department and the road will not be turned over to Mr. Buckley's department for two or three months. While refusing to make a positive statement, Mr. Buckley said that it was his opinion that the construction department would place an accommodation train in service as soon as the road could be operated in about three weeks.

The train will probably carry one sleeper and day coaches and do a small freight business. The train will be scheduled to leave Lewiston in the evening, making connection at Riparia with the Portland flyer from Spokane. While this schedule may not be adopted by the construction department it has been suggested by officials that such a service would accommodate the people.

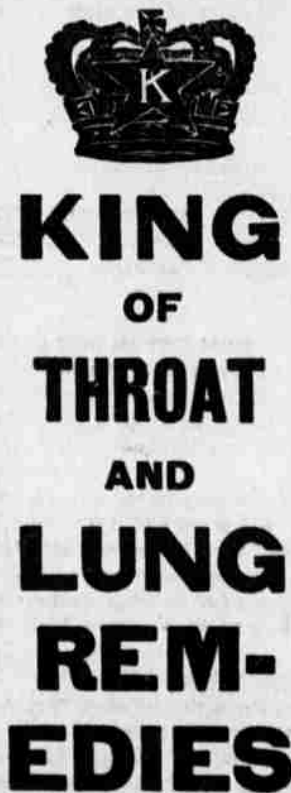
