velt has since put into practical commission, are the ones which today decry the action and policies of the present president, the speaker gave vent to a slight burst of party enthusiasm.

He did, however, pay a very fitting tribute to United States Senator Robert M. La Follette of Wisconsin, when he classed that individual as one of the few United States senators who represent the people of the state from which they come. Governor Folk, Theodore Roosevelt and Senator La Follette were frequently placed in the same category.

"The issues in this senatorial campaign," said the speaker, "are fitness and capacity." Both, he maintained, were qualifications which he was imbued with to a much higher degree than H. M. Calkins, the republican nominee.

German Steamer Wrecked.

New York, May 8.—Suffering from exhaustion, caused by a storm, 73 men of the German steamer Rickmers were rescued today, the subsidence of the storm allowing tugs to reach the vessel.

The Peter Rickmers went ashore 11 miles west of Fire Island. Thirty-three are members of the ship's crew and the balance are men sent out to unload the Rickmers by a wrecking company when it first went aground. A storm sprang up and the hulk was battered to pieces.

One man is missing and it is feared he was swept overboard last night.

To Hold Olympic Trials.

San Francisco, May 8.—Pacific coast try-outs for the Olympic team to London will be held on the oval of Stanford university tomorrow, in accordance with the plans decided upon by the board of governors of the Pacific Athletic association. The Stanford track was chosen because of its superiority to others on the coast and its construction along standard lines, and the many athletes will have an opportunity to show at their best in an effort to win a place on the American team that will go to London this summer.

Tennessee Educators.

Paris, Tenn., May 8.—Several hundred members of the West Tennessee Educational association are here today in attendance at the annual session of the organization.

The people of Elgin have raised \$140 and the county court has appropriated the same amount for the improvement of the county road on Looking Glass hill. This road is almost impassible and their intention is to cut down and grade the hill.

Albany, N. Y., May 8.—In compliance with the proclamation of A. S. Draper, commissioner of education, Arbor day will be observed today in the public schools throughout the state.
