### SPRAY FOR LAWNS.

Experiments Prove Dandelion Can Be Killed.

Two special nuisances in lawns are dandelions and plantain. The tests made at the North Dakota experiment station have given good results in killing these pests by spraying. It requires persistent work, but if a lawn is sprayed once each month, or once in six weeks, the dandelion is kept completely in check. As seeds are blown to great distances by the wind, the destruction of the established roots does not insure future freedom from the pest, but spraying is the easiest and most effective method of keeping the dandelions down, which has yet been found. Use iron sulphate in the proportion of two pounds for each gallon of water. Do not spray within two days of the time of cutting and do not cut the grass or water the lawn for two or three days after spraying.

### Condemn Disfranchisement.

Macon, Ga., May 13.—Georgia republicans, both white and black, are gathering in Macon today for the state convention of the party, which will be held tomorrow and which will nominate a state ticket and elect four delegates at large to Chicago. Although President Roosevelt has been endorsed by the state committee and a movement has been set on foot to demand his nomination for a "second elective term," it is likely that the negroes will oppose any attempt to instruct the delegates for Taft. The Georgia disfranchisement act has been bitterly condemned by the state committee. Despite this, the negro wing of the party has issued a call in which the committee is declared to be "dominated by federal office holders, henchmen and political tricksters," and to be "the most rotten and corrupt organization that has ever disgraced any state of this great union."

## PADDOCK TO PENDLETON

Having completed an exhaustive tour of the Vale, Nyssa and Ontario countries, Bishop Paddock, of the Eastern Oregon diocese of the Episcopal church, passed through La Grande today en route to Pendleton, where he stays for a day and then goes to Portland by slow degrees to attend a conference there next week. The bishop will not return to La Grande for several months, possibly. The Pendleton East Oregonian says of the bishop's coming to that city:

After an absence of a month from the city during which time he has visited practically every county in the eastern Oregon diocese of the Episcopal church, Bishop Paddock will return to Pendleton tomorrow and tomorrow evening will preach at the Church of the Redeemer and also confirm a large class of new members.

The services will be held at 8 o'clock and all are cordially invited to attend. A collection for the general missions fund will be taken during the service.

Bishop Paddock has now been over the eastern Oregon diocese thoroughly and it is hoped that he may be able while in the city on this occasion to discuss the matter of locating headquarters for the diocese. Pendleton being the geographical center of the diocese, is hopeful of securing the headquarters where an elegant cathedral may be erected as well as home for the bishop.
