SPRAY FOR LAWNS.

Experiments Prove Dandellon Can B Killed.

Two special nuisances in lawns are dandellons and plantin. The tests made at the North Dakota experiment station have given good results in killing these pests by spraying. It requires persistent work, but if a lawn is sprayed once each month, or once in six weeks, the dandelion is kept completely in check. As seeds are blown to great distances by the wind the destruction of the established roots does not insure future freedom from the pest, but spraying is the easiest and most effective method of keeping the dandelions down, which has yet been found. Use iron sulphate in the proportion of two pounds for each gallon of water. Do not spray within two days of the time of cutting and do not cut the grass or water the lawr for two or three days after spraying
