A meeting was held in this city Wednesday with the cattlemen, so that there will be no trouble about the boundaries In the past cattle and sheep have been running promiscuously over the range but under the new regime each man will keep on his own ground. This will afford the sheepmen an opportunity for increasing their bands by several thousand head.
