Baptists in Oklahoma.
Oklahoma City, Okla., May 19.—Oklahoma City is today the Mecca of hundreds of distinguished Baptist clergymen, laymen and missionaries, who are flocking to the metropolis of the new state from all over the world to take part in the various conventions which will mark Baptist anniversary week.

The formal program will be inaugurated tomorrow with the meeting of the National Women's Baptist Home Mission society, when well known women from all parts of the country and from foreign lands will speak. The Northern Baptist convention will assemble on Thursday, and on Friday the American Baptist Home Mission society will open its 76th annual meeting. The American Baptist Forward movement for missionary education, and other denominational organizations will also hold sessions. A special feature of these meetings will be a discussion of the missionary work of the church among the Indians of the southwest and many redskin converts will be in attendance.

South Carolina Doubtful.

Columbia, S. C., May 19.—Whether South Carolina will climb into the band wagon of William Jennings Bryan support his candidacy in the Denver convention will be decided tomorrow, when the democratic state convention will convene in this city. While the rank and file of voters have not manifested a great deal of interest in the matter, a fierce newspaper controversy has been waged over the Bryan endorsement question. Both the Nebraskan's supporters and the anti-Bryan men are claiming certain victory in tomorrow's convention.

Split in Michigan.

Lansing, Mich., May 19.—Bryan is the rock on which the Michigan democracy threatens to split, when the state convention is called to order here tomorrow. Sentiment among the delegates who are gathered in the hotel lobbies today is about evenly divided between the Nebraskan and Governor Johnson of Minnesota, and a warm fight between the two factions is expected when an attempt is made to pledge the delegation to Bryan.

California Club Women.

San Francisco, May 19.—Some of the brightest minds among California's feminine population will be present when the State Federation of Women's club meets in Oakland tomorrow. Final arrangements for the session were completed today, the program of addresses, papers and music being the most notable in the history of the women's club movement on the coast.

Missouri Democrats.

Jefferson City, Mo., May 19.—Missouri's democracy is gathering in force in the state capital today, preliminary to tomorrow's state convention. Four delegates at large and two delegates for each congressional district of the state will be elected to go to Denver. Presidential electors and a national committeeman will also be chosen. Bryan's endorsement by the convention is apparently a foregone conclusion.

Elks Meet in Peoria.

Peoria, Ill., May 19.—Large herds of the antlered tribe are arriving in Peoria today for the state convention of Illinois Elks, which will be held in this city during the next three days. Business houses throughout the city have been decorated with the colors and emblems of the order, several bands have been engaged and other arrangements made to render the gathering a memorable one.

Launch Big Collier.

New York, May 19.—Uncle Sam's new \$1,500,000 collier, the Vestal, the largest vessel of its kind among the navies of the world, was launched today at the Brooklyn navy yard. Miss Goodrich, daughter of the commandant of the yard, christened the ship. Many distinguished naval officials witnessed the ceremonies.
