WM. HACKETT DIED TODAY

This morning at 9 o'clock William Hackett died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Fred Swaney. Mr. Hackett had been in ill health for a number of months, and while his death was a great shock to the relatives and friends, it was not altogether unexpected. Mr. Hackett was 73 years of age, and had been a resident of La Grande for the past eight years. He was born in Staffordshire, England, but came to the United States when but 9 years of age. He was a man of strong character, one of those men who commanded the respect and love of all with whom he came in personal contact. Especially were the children and young men drawn to him from the fact that he was always ready and willing to assist or advise. To the older people he was what might be termed reticent, but at the same time was always ready to take a decided stand for what he considered right and proper. He was a man whose friendship was an honor; whose companionship a true pleasure. He leaves two daughters and a son, his wife having preceded him to the other life two years ago last Thanksgiving day. The children are: Mrs. Fred Swaney of this city; Mrs. J. A. Jackson of Council Bluffs, Iowa, and H. B. Hackett, now residing in Oklahoma. Both have been notified of their father's death. Mrs. Jackson will come to La Grande, but it is not known at this time if the son can come. Funeral arrangements cannot be made until Mrs. Jackson arrives. The deceased was an active member of the Episcopal church, and also a member of the Masonic lodge.
