Parade of Madmen.

Guthrie, Okla., May 22.—Several hundred buggies, carriages and other vehicles were used to transport the insane patients from the railroad station at Fargo to the new state asylum a Fort Supply, 10 miles distant, forming one of the most novel processions ever seen in Oklahoma. The work of transferring the patients from the private sanitarium at Norman to Fort Supply will not be completed until July. The former government military post which will hereafter be used as a home for the insane is 10 miles from a railroad, and all patients will have to be transported overland.
