Ordinance No. 379, Series 1908.

An ordinance amending section 1 of Ordinance No. 274, Series 1905.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That section 1 of Ordinance No. 274, Series 1905, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. That any person or persons wishing to use, run or operate in the city of La Grande, Oregon, any swing or merry-go-round, shall pay to the city treasurer the sum of \$3.00 per day or \$75.00 per week for each day of such applicant desires a license, and shall obtain a receipt from the treasurer for said sum so paid. Such applicant shall present said receipt to the city recorder and demand a license to run or operate such swing or merry-go-round, and if in the judgment of the recorder such applicant is a fit, proper and suitable person, he shall issue a license to such applicant for the proper time; provided, however, that such license shall expressly state that such swing or merry-go-round shall not be run or operated on the first day of the week commonly called Sunday, nor after the hour of 10 p. m. of each day.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer, and after its approval by the mayor, shall be in full force and take effect on and after the 23d day of June, 1908.

Passed the common council on the 20th day of May, 1908.

Ordinance No. 380, Series 1908.

An ordinance making property furnished with water by the city, liable for the water rent, and declaring the same a lien on the same.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That all lots or parts of lots, together with the buildings thereon, if any, or and to which water is supplied by the city, shall be, and the same are hereby made liable to the city, for the rent of the water so supplied; and the rent for said water shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be a lien upon said property.

Sec. 2. That in the event any rent for water shall not be paid as provided for in this ordinance, regulating the supplying of water by the city to its customers, then the sums due or said rent shall become a lien upon the parcel of property owned or under the control of such person or persons, or company or corporation failing, neglecting or refusing to pay the rent due for water furnished to said property, and the said lien shall be docketed, and the same enforced and foreclosed as provided for the enforcement and foreclosure of other liens on real property by the ordinances of the city.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer, and be in full force and effect after its approval by the mayor, on and after the 23d day of June, 1908.

Passed the common council on the 20th day of May, 1908.
