TAFT AND BRYAN

Will Win Out if the Birds and Spiders Are Right.

It is claimed that the celebrated trained and talking parrots, "Abe Martin," so called to honor Ken Hubbard, the Indiana cartoonist, and "Ella W." named after Ella Wheeler Wilcox of literary fame, possess the power of prophecy to a remarkable degree. These autocratic birds abide with the Sells-Floto circus, and are the only breeding parrots in captivity.
