An amendment to Article VII of the Constitution by increasing the number of judges of the Supreme Court from three to five, until otherwise provided by law, and authorizing the Legislative Assembly to provide by appropriate legislation for the exercise by the Circuit Courts, of the probate jurisdiction theretofore exer-cised by the County Courts, and for the transaction of County business by and before some appropriate body or tribunal. Vote Yes or No.

### Referendum Ordered by Petition of the People.

An act providing that in all counties, the sheriff shall have the cus-tody of prisoners committed to or comfined in the county jail and such prisoners shall be worked at such places and for such time and in such manner as the County Court may direct, and that in counties of over one hundred thousand inhabitants, the salaries of guards and jailers shall not exceed \$90.00 per month and the price of meals furnished prisoners shall be 13 ½ c each.
