Will Have Roses.
The roses are coming. Today's
weather, partly cloudy, a little sprink-
ling of rain, just enough sun to keep
the air warm but not so much that
there is any danger of scorching the
buds, is exactly what they have
needed, says the Portland Journal.
People who have wanted warm weath-
er and bright sunshine, to bring out
their crop of beauties, haven't had
much dealing with roses. The back-
ward spring has made the buds par-
ticularly tender and the stems are soft
and easily broken. A week of sun-
shine and hot weather now would
scorch the buds, bring out imperfec-
tions in the roses and damage the
quality and quantity of the crop. In
the judgment of rose culturists today's
weather is just the thing needed to
uphold Portland's claim as the Rose
city. True, some of the rarer varie-
ties of roses which the specialists have
been preparing for the exhibition on
Tuesday may not be ready. The back-
ward season has caused some growers
to ask that the exhibition itself and
the competition for prizes be post-
poned for a week or 10 days, but this
would disappoint many rose experts
who are coming to Portland for the
festival and it is improbable that it
will be done.
