At the wool sale held at Pilot Rock this morning, nine clips, aggregating over 200,000 pounds of wool, were sold at prices ranging from 10 1/4 cents to 13 3/4.—Pendleton East Oregonian.

At a meeting of the U. of O. athletic council Saturday Olen Arnsperger, '09, was unanimously elected assistant football coach for the coming season. Arnsperger has another year in college, but has played his limit under the four-year rule. He entered the university in the fall of 1904 and at once played tackle on the 'varsity eleven, besides winning a coveted position on the All-Northwest team at the end of the season. He played regularly as tackle for four years under Coaches Smith, Shorts, Besdek and Frost, and at the close of last season was again honored with a place on the All-Northwest eleven.—Eugene Herald.

A deal that has been under headway for the past few days was consummated Wednesday whereby the Bank of Welser and the First National bank were merged into one institution and on next Monday will open as the First National.—Baker City Democrat.

**EXCURSION CALLED OFF.**

There will be no excursion to La Grande next Sunday, says the Baker City Herald. That was settled for good and all last night when the railroad company, through agents at this place, informed the executive committee of the Baker Concert band that a special train would cost \$208. But there was further stipulation in the contract, and it was this additional agreement where the band committee balked and declared all negotiations at an end. The railroad assured the boys a train would be run for \$208 but if they should sell over that amount in tickets, the surplus was to go into the coffers of the road, and not in the treasury of the band. And,

again that no tickets could be sold for less than \$1.55.

Then the band entered a counter proposition just to test the pulse of the corporation in which they asked if a special excursion were organized and sufficient tickets sold to insure the train, could the band get transportation for their trouble of getting up this excursion. Politely but firmly this offer was refused, and the announcement was made by those representing the band that the proposed excursion is off.
