### Campaign Closes Tonight.

In the Empire theater tonight Governor George E. Chamberlain will make his first speech of the campaign in Portland. Tomorrow, the last day of the campaign for both parties will be consumed by the governor in flying from one town in the county to another, making speeches in automobile. H. M. Calk closes his campaign in eastern Oregon, leaving the final remarks on his candidacy in the hands of Henry E. McGinn and S. A. Lowell, who will appear at the Empire Friday night, says the Telegram of yesterday.

The campaign is growing warmer, and the spellbinders are more active than ever, since they must cease speaking tomorrow night, no political meetings being favored Saturday, Memorial day.

This evening nine automobiles will be sent out by the republicans, each containing four speakers. They will spellbind on the street corners wherever they can find crowds. All the principal street intersections will be visited by the bubble wagons. The same corps of automobiles will be used tomorrow night, when the speakers will again search the highways for audiences.

Democrats are arranging for a red-hot reception to Chamberlain at the Empire tonight. Mayor Lane will preside and on the platform will be a large number of prominent citizens. There will be a few musical numbers and several speeches, but Governor Chamberlain will be the star attraction.

Elaborate preparations are being made by the republicans for their final stand tomorrow night at the Empire. George H. Williams has been selected as the presiding officer, and McGinn and Lowell will be the principal speakers. Calk, himself, is busy east of the mountains, where he has been travelling for the past two weeks. He will return home in time to vote Monday morning.

### "Eruption of Vesuvius."

The reservations for seats and boxes for Pain's fireworks spectacle, "Eruption of Vesuvius," began yesterday morning, says the Oregonian, at the downtown office, northeast corner of Sixth and Alder. Much interest is being shown in this new production of the fireworks king, and it is predicted that large audiences will be assembled at Multnomah Athletic field to witness the seven performances, the first of which is next Saturday night.

The athletic field is rapidly undergoing a great transformation in preparation for the mounting of the big scenery and buildings which picture the city of Naples with the bay and frowning volcano in the background. Another carload of fireworks has arrived and the pyrotechnic force is already on the field with numerous tents and sheds for the construction of the large set pieces and special designs, which will be changed from night to night in the fireworks program, following the destruction of the mimic city. Some of the acrobatic teams and specialties have already arrived, and more are on their way from Chicago.
