To Build Eagle Road.

At last all doubts concerning the building of the Eagle Valley railway are removed, says the Baker City Democrat.

Yesterday A. B. Jacobs, chief engineer of the construction company that is to build the road, arrived in the city from Cincinnati, O., and to a Democrat representative he gave out the statement that construction work would begin about July 1.

Mr. Jacobs' principal business in Baker City at this time is to file the trust deed and mortgage upon which bonds are to be issued and for which all arrangements have been definitely made. This is certainly good news to the people of Baker county, especially those of the east end of the county, who see in the operation of a railway the beginning of a wonderful advancement and development of all that rich country east of Baker City to Snake river, which possesses untold wealth in minerals, fruitgrowing, agriculture and stockgrowing.
