WALTERS WINS QUARTERS.

Island City Athlete Carries Off Six Points in Interscholastic.
Harry Walters of Island City, comes back from Corvallis with six points to his credit, and considering his time in the quarter-mile, he has reason to feel elated over his performance. He ran a splendid race in the quarter, taking first with 53.2-5 seconds. He also took a third in the 220-yard dash. Island City and Baker City scored equally, while Ontario and Pendleton, the other eastern towns, each came in for a share of the meat. Following are the winners in the interscholastic finals, which were run off on Saturday afternoon, in which West Portland high won first place:
