

ELGIN GIRL IS BURNED

Elgin, June 1.—(Special.)—One of the most terrible accidents that have occurred in this city in years happened yesterday morning when the 5-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs.

William Wiggins sustained such frightful burns that the child died soon after.
About 8 o'clock the mother had gone out to do some chores and had left the little girl alone in the house. It is presumed she commenced to play with matches. At any rate when the mother returned, it was to find her daughter enveloped in flames. Every possible help was extended to the suffering one, but she died in two hours. Her body was frightfully burned, as the cruel flames had been given time to reach every part of her anatomy. The funeral was held this afternoon.
