PACIFIC FIELD MEET.

Noted Athletes From All Over the Northwest Will Participate.

Portland, Ore., June 5.—All the leading amateur athletic clubs, schools and colleges of the Pacific coast will be represented by entries in tomorrow's great track and field meet of the Pacific Northwest association, California, Washington and Oregon amateurs will participate and the meet will decide the championship of the Pacific coast. As the athletic feature of this week's big rose carnival, the meet will probably be witnessed by a record-breaking crowd.

The Olympic club of San Francisco, has again sent a team north and hopes to gather in a goodly share of honors. Last year, the Olympic club team of four men composed of Glarner, Cheek, Gerhardt and Gilmore, won the championship, each contestant of the winged "O" organization taking two first places. Cheek annexing an additional three points with second place in the high jump.

St. Helena's Dire Straits.
St. Helena, the famous island prison of the great Napoleon, is in dire straits. After the war in Africa a lot of Boer prisoners were sent there and for a time there was prosperity, but now the prisoners are gone and the troops guarding them have been transferred to other duties. The islanders are left high and dry financially.

Some flax is grown in the island, but the roads are so miserably bad it cannot be gotten to market. Most of the islanders have cattle, but the farmers are killing their young calves because it is not profitable to raise them. The women and children have taken up lace making, but their product is not sufficiently fine to find a ready market.

Government help for the islanders has been asked. Unless it is extended, suffering and even starvation may mark the spot where the great Cornican warrior spent his last days.
