**Ordinance No. 386, Series 1905.**

An ordinance providing for the building of cement sidewalks in certain residence districts of the city of La Grande.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That hereinafter, when the portions of the streets hereinafter named, in the residence districts of the city, are to be improved by constructing sidewalks in and along the same, said sidewalks shall be built of cement, to-wit:

On Main avenue from Fourth street to First street.

On Washington avenue from Spruce street to First street.

On Adams avenue from Fourth street to Cedar street.

On Second street from Palmer avenue to Spring avenue.

On Third street from Grandy avenue to Main avenue.

On Pennsylvania avenue from Washington avenue to Fourth street.

On First street from Washington avenue to Monroe avenue.

On O avenue from Fourth street to Fifth street.

On Elm street from Jefferson avenue to Pennsylvania avenue.

On Spring avenue from Washington avenue to Fourth street.

Sec. 2. That inasmuch as it is desirable, and necessary for the safety and comfort of the inhabitants of the city, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall, after its approval by the mayor, and its publication in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer, take effect on and after the 6th day of June, 1905.

Passed the common council on the 3d day of June, 1905, by eight members voting therefor.

Approved this 6th day of June, 1905. **M. K. HALL,** Mayor.

**Pendleton Market Day.**

Forty head of horses, several vehicles and other equipment are being auctioned off at the Market day sale being held at the pavilion this afternoon.
