Line to Be Built Across the Cascades—To Complete Survey This Summer.

Civil Engineers C. R. Rankin and his corps of surveyors, who have been working in California all winter are expected to arrive in Eugene in a few days and will go right to work finishing up the work on the survey of the road across the Cascades from Natron to Ontario, and another line from Klamath Falls to California. This will be the third year this same corps of surveyors has been on this route and they will no doubt complete it this year. With the improvements the company has made in Eugene this year, it seems very evident that this will be made a division point for the new road and if it does it will add greatly to our prestige from every standpoint.—Eugene Register.

England Feeding School Children. The provisions of the Meals act, which provides for the feeding of hungry school children, is now in force and is resulting in some curious prosecutions. There is a clause in the act which enable the corporation to recover the cost of meals furnished from parents who are in a position to pay, but who neglect to do so. At Bradford city court the other day five parents whose children had partaken of the free meals and who were deemed able to provide for their own offspring, were hauled before the judge and ordered to pay sums ranging from six to 21 shillings, unless paid or commitment to jail for deliberate fraud. The parents paid.

Strong Democrat Re-elected. County Superintendent of Schools, E. Bragg of Union county, has been re-elected to that position against a strong and popular republican candidate by a handsome majority. Mr. Bragg has held the position against all comers for several terms, and is considered one of the strong and leading educators of this state. He was appointed regent of the normal schools by Governor Chamberlain, and his election is a splendid approval for good work done in every capacity.—Salem Journal.
