BRANDON IN WALLOWA

With only 7 1/2 miles of right of way to grade, and that in comparatively level country, with material in La Grande ready to be shipped to the front, and almost in full action in constructing the railroad bridge across the Grande Ronde river, the O. R. & N. is in position to say that the extension into Wallowa county will be completed in something like 90 days. Engineer Brandon is again at the front, going in this morning. As a representative of the company, he has let the contracts for completing the grades to two parties: Mr. Mitchell of Joseph, who will do the grading in the vicinity of Lostine, and Mr. Patterson, who will do the Enterprise work. While these men are fulfilling their contracts, the company will be constructing the bridge across the Grande Ronde. The local yard is full of material to be used on the work.
