## ADMISSION IS LIBERAL

As the date of the grand organ opening concert at the L. D. S. church approaches, the management is hurrying plans for entertaining a monster crowd of people, as well as preparing an up-to-date program. The plans for the seating of the crowd which is expected to fill the house to overflowing, are now being made and will soon be posted in various sections of the city. The prices are popular ones, allowing everybody an opportunity of attending.

**The Seat System.**  
One hundred and fifty of the best seats, located in the center of the auditorium, will be reserved for \$1.50. Then there will be about 50 reserved seats on the same floor at \$1. Two hundred seats, approximately, will be at the disposal of general admission on the lower floor for 75 cents.

In the balcony, there will be two sections, consisting of 150 seats for reserve at \$1. The balance of the gallery is to be 50 cents, general admission.

### NEW CITIZENS.

#### Several La Grande People Go Out Naturalization Papers.

Among the names of those who applied for citizenship papers at the June term of the circuit court are H. Pattison and H. R. Pattison. The brothers arrived in this country from England on December 1, 1885. Others wishing to become citizens are B. Niewald, from Germany, January 1, 1879; Colin McKenzie, Scotland, April 25, 1877; Hy Possett, Denmark, November, 1906; William Peiper, Germany, December, 1883; John Hacker and Emil Naffin, both from the Fatherland, Hacker in 1888 and Naffin 10 years later. All landed first in New York except Mr. Niewald, who made his first direct acquaintance with our institutions in Philadelphia.

### Fenced U. S. Land.

Dick Beckman, a farmer living near Grass Valley, Sherman county, was fined \$50 yesterday at Portland and sentenced to spend six hours in jail, by Judge Wolverton in the United States district court, having been indicted by the grand jury on a charge of illegally fencing government land, says The Dalles Chronicle. The land which Beckman is said to have fenced is in Sherman county. He had a fence around 740 acres. Beckman's defense was that he did not know he was doing wrong and that the fence was removed as soon as the question was called to his attention. Beckman was represented in court by counsel and a plea of guilty as charged was entered.
